Elective Courses

FINC851/861, 852/856, 862 comprise the finance practice module. Students may substitute an elective for each of these courses for which they have extensive work experience or prior coursework in the area. Other courses may be used towards the degree requirements if submitted as part of the student's program of study and approved by the MS Finance Program Director prior to registration in the course.
