Dissertation Title: "Exploring Cross-Border Business Model Adaptation"

Dissertation Outline: This paper explores the adaptation of business models to multiple external environments necessitated by cross-border expansion of firm activity. Broadly defined as the way a firm organizes its available resources to deliver and capture value, we conceptualize the business model through the RCOV framework distinguishing between three integral components - resources and competences, organization, and value propositions - which interact to create a competitive advantage. Through an inductive study with several embedded cases within a large multinational company, the paper describes how the business model and its components have been modified in response to different external conditions. These cases serve as the basis for developing three theoretical insights on business model adaptation. First, we propose four patterns of business model adaptation in response to multiple contextual pressures – Appendage, Segmentation, Reconfiguration, and Avoidance. Second, we classify contextual effects on the business model. Third, we integrate these two typologies to derive a theory linking types of external demands and patterns of business model adaptation. The paper seeks to contribute to the literature and the practice of global business which have long advocated the need to adapt business models when facing complex environments, yet has not offered systematic research on the topic.
